


# **Breaking Down**



Behavioral health systems have traditionally been siloed, making it extremely difficult to provide consistent high-level behavioral health care for children in Michigan.

 Through various grants, partnerships, and State School Aid Act funds, Michigan has created a collaborative solution using technology that connects students to behavioral health services across multiple settings.



# Reduce Youth Suicides and Meet Student Mental Health Needs

- •The long-range vision and purpose of this project is to reduce youth suicides and meet other mental health needs by building a comprehensive statewide system designed with multiple perspectives, views and users in mind.
- •A statewide, student-centered system will assist ISDs, school districts, child and adolescent health centers, state and local governments, social service agencies and healthcare organizations to seamlessly work together to identify and support students at risk for behavioral health issues.



#### Michigan's Vision for Statewide Deployment of bhworks


- MDE made bhworks, from Medical Decision Logic (mdlogix), available to all 56
  Intermediate School Districts (ISDs) in May 2021. This software platform
  provides consent, screening, identifying, referral, care coordination, treatment
  monitoring, and real-time data collection while streamlining confidential
  communication with families, school staff and providers.
- mdlogix has worked 15+ years to layer the best practices on top of a technology infrastructure to prevent and identify mental health issues.
- bhworks is web-based, HIPAA compliant, and obtained Authority to Operate following a detailed RMF (Risk Management Framework) NIST 800-53 RMF audit for compliance and security.

## Rapid adoption and use of bhworks in Michigan

• From October 2021 – September 2022, a rapid adoption of *bhworks* was underway, with 60% of ISDs/ESAs/RESAs using the system.


• From fall 2021 to fall 2022, there were 6,650 student mental health referrals generated from *bhworks* and 3,451 students went to treatment. The early benefits, from *bhworks*-generated data, show that Michigan 31n providers are obtaining parent consent and providing services to students faster – from days or weeks to within 24 hours.

 With a web-based, electronic system, there is less paperwork and using one platform (bhworks) that has integrated with other Michigan systems including MiDataHub, increases efficiency. This time-saving efficiency helps with the state provider shortage.








### Referrals across Michigan






#### **Non-Diagnostic Referral Reasons**




